

Practice Privileges/Mobility in Wyoming

Firms and individuals who provide professional accounting services from locations outside of Wyoming may do so without obtaining or maintaining a Wyoming certificate or permit under some circumstances.

To determine if you or your firm qualifies for practice privileges or are required to license, please access the Mobility Checklist on the Forms page of the Board's website.

Individuals who currently hold licenses in the state of their principal place of business and do not provide services from a Wyoming location as their principal place of business will have the option to continue to maintain the Wyoming certificate as they have in the past or avail themselves of practice privileges.

Individuals who return the Wyoming certificate are given a "mobility" status which will be displayed when a database search is performed. Individuals who do not return the certificate and allow the certificate to expire will be given an "expired" status. An "expired" status does not mean that one cannot use practice privileges. It simply means the certificate was allowed to expire.

Individuals who hold licenses in the state of their principal place of business and provide services in Wyoming cannot elect to place the active Wyoming certificate on inactive status. Individuals who reside in another state and hold Wyoming certificates on an inactive status may either continue to maintain the certificate on inactive status if they do not perform accounting services in Wyoming or allow the certificate to expire.

When individuals and firms exercise practice privileges they simultaneously consent to personal and subject matter jurisdiction and the disciplinary authority of the Wyoming Board; they agree to comply with Wyoming law and Wyoming Board rules and regulations; they agree to cease offering or rendering accounting services in Wyoming if the license they hold is no longer valid in the state where the principal place of business is located; and they consent to the appointment of the state board which issued their license as their agent upon which process may be served in any action or proceeding by the Wyoming Board against the licensee.

If the firm provides services which requires licensure, each firm is required to designate a certificate holder of some state to be responsible for the proper registration of the firm. The firm must identify the responsible CPA and provide contact information, including an email address, for that person. Firms previously licensed are free to activate an expired permit at any time using the professional license renewal online system located on the Board's website.
